Arcola Theatre Launches New Eco-Theatre Concept

At London's City Hall tomorrow, representatives from Arcola Theatre and sustainable design innovators Arup present plans for the development of a new eco-theatre in Dalston, East London.

The project will be the UK's first major theatre to place environmental sustainability at the core of operations and programme.

Mehmet Egen, Artistic Director and founder of Arcola Theatre said: "Our new building will include an exquisite 350 seat theatre allowing us to create an even greater and more diverse programme, building on our past nine years of success".

Dr Ben Todd, Executive Director of Arcola Theatre, said: "Wrapped around the main stage will be dynamic spaces to accommodate our ever-growing environmental sustainability and community engagement programmes. Our aim is to create a place Da Vinci would call home where creative people from multiple disciplines drive innovation for a sustainable and equitable future"

Global engineering and design consultancy Arup has been appointed to provide theatre and acoustical consultancy services. Arup Associates, Arup's multidisciplinary design studio, will provide integrated architecture and engineering design for the new venue's initial feasibility study, funded by the London Development Agency.

The venue will offer improved facilities and capacity for artists and audiences, integrated with a platform for art, science, community and business to showcase and deliver approaches to sustainable living.

The expanded Arcola Theatre will incorporate several types of space:

- Flexible theatres/artistic spaces, including the main house theatre seating 350 (500 standing), a 150 seat black-box studio theatre, an 80 seat second studio theatre, a rehearsal space and a flexible studio;
- A main foyer with bar/café/restaurant and informal meeting space;
- Office for theatre staff and energy scientists;
- Green rooms and backstage technical workshops;
- A Bike Hub for bicycle storage with close proximity to public transport;
- Incubator units for scientific and industrial companies to conduct research and development into sustainable technologies;
- Public garden and growing space

Neill Woodger, director of Arup's theatre consulting and acoustics business comments on the project: "Our brief is to conceive a theatre that exemplifies sustainability. It must provide the highest levels of artistic experience for artists and

audiences, whilst being affordable to build and economical to operate. It must contribute positively to the environment and local community and lead the way in promoting a shift across the arts to a more ecological business model. If Future Arcola is to be the benchmark that helps London's theatres reduce carbon emissions 60% by 2025, environmental performance must take centre-stage in all aspects of design and operations. Future Arcola is the first venue to use a sustainability framework to define a brief and conceptual design for a new theatre, and it will set a new level of performance in theatre design."

The Theatre will be located in the heart of Dalston.

The City Hall reception will highlight the role of the new Arcola Theatre in the ongoing regeneration of Hackney, led by the London Borough of Hackney and supported by the London Development Agency.

Cllr Guy Nicholson, Hackney Council Cabinet Member for Regeneration and the 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games, said: "Hackney Council is committed to supporting the Arcola to find a new site for its innovative eco-theatre, ensuring that the Arcola continues to contribute to the cultural excitement that is Dalston."

London Mayor Boris Johnson said "HOLDING TEXT BY BEN NOT BORIS Our cultural offer is fundamental to the future prosperity of London. Arcola's approach to integrating art, environmental sustainability and urban regeneration is a great exemplar of our vision for London."

A programme of public realm improvements will help integrate the new development with the existing town centre, and enhance the cultural mix.
